Start 'em young: A checklist to grow great money habits

Help your child set a savings goal, and develop a plan to earn the money they need.

Bonus Work: Using simple terms, discuss the need to think about 'needs' like groceries, power and gas before spending on 'wants' like movie tickets or a new pair of shoes.

Help the children in your life experience the joy of giving back by encouraging them to identify a toy they no longer play with, or a cherished article of clothing, they could donate to someone less fortunate.

Bonus Work: Talk about why it's important to share what we have with those who may not have as much.

Discuss with your child about less-expensive alternatives to common purchases like eating out or going to the movies.

Bonus Work: Take the time to enjoy a home-cooked meal or at-home movie night together. Discuss how the less costly option is often just as much fun, as you save what you could have spent for the future.
